Bedding is provided but boarders may bring their own bedding if preferred. All items must be clearly labelled.

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

MEASUREMENT GUIDE



HEIGHT

Measure from the top of the head down to the ground – make sure the child is barefoot with their heels together and feet flat on the floor.

HIPS

Place the tape measure around the fullest part of the bottom.

СНЕЅТ

Take the tape through the arms and around the fullest part of the chest.

INSIDE LEG

Measure with shoes on to approximately 5cm above the ground.

WAIST

Place the tape measure around the natural waistline, taking care not to pull it too tightly.

COLLAR

Place the tape measure around the base of the neck where the collar usually sits, again taking care not to pull the tape too tightly as it is important to have a little extra room around the neck.

APPEARANCE

In addition to pupils being required to wear the correct uniform, they are also expected to adhere to our rules on appearance.

Any pupils who choose to have additional piercings done in the holidays should make sure piercings are healed before school starts; pupils will not be allowed to wear additional studs, transparent or otherwise, whilst the piercing heals.

Girls in Year 9 – 11 may wear a single stud in the earlobe and girls in the Sixth Form may wear a single stud or a small pair of hoops or drop earrings in each earlobe. Pupils will be asked to remove jewellery for sport and for some other practical subjects.

Pupils may wear a simple necklace to school and one plain ring on each hand. No bracelets may be worn.

Pupils should not wear nail varnish or have extension nails as these cannot be removed easily for sport.

Pupils who wish to wear additional jewellery connected to their faith should speak to their housemaster or housemistress (HSM). Religious headwear may be worn.

Any pupil wishing to wear any form of headwear for any other reason should seek permission from the Deputy Head (Pastoral).

Haircuts should be arranged outside of school hours except in exceptional circumstances whereby the HSM may allow a pupil to go to Holt to visit a barber or hairdresser. Pupils are not allowed to cut or colour their hair in school and should not allow others to do this for them. Hair should always be neat and tidy and of a natural colour. Pupils in Years 9 – 11 should tie their hair back as soon as it is long enough to do so.

The Sixth Form allows for pupils to choose their own business suit to wear to school within the parameters set out in the uniform list. It is important that suits are a sober, classic tailored suit and that any pinstripes are subtle. Skirts worn by Sixth Formers should be on or below the knee.

There is a difference between the shirt colour in Year 12 and 13 and those in Year 13 who are house or school prefects; this should be respected.Waistcoats may only be worn by school prefects. Shirts should have a collar and suitable for school i.e. no stretch fabrics or broderie. No pupil may wear a cardigan or roll neck jumper.
